in the vineyard :

Soil Type: Sandy, loam topsoil to granitic gravel subsoils

This is reportedly the second oldest recorder vineyard of Chenin Blanc in South Africa, planted in 1947, the wine was made with the absolute minimum intervention and to allow the old vines to express the true flavours of the site and variety with as gentle a human touch as possible.

about the harvest: All grapes were hand picked from bushvines planted in 1947.

in the cellar : Pressed whole bunch and then fermented with natural yeast in 2 new French oak barrels. Sulphured after primary fermentation to prevent MLF, followed by 11 months maturation on the lees.
