in the vineyard : The grapes were sourced from bush vines and low-trellised vineyards in the Stellenbosch, Franschhoek, Wellington and Malmesbury regions.

The vineyards are located at altitudes varying from 90 metres to 160 metres above sea level. Some of the vineyards grow under dryland conditions while others receive supplementary irrigation.

about the harvest: The grapes, mostly Chenin Blanc, were harvested at 25° to 32° Balling. At this level of ripeness, a high percentage of raisins is found in the bunches.

in the cellar : In the cellar, the juice was left on the skins for a minimum of ten hours to ensure intensity of flavour and colour. The juice was next cleaned and inoculated with pure yeast. Fermentation was stopped when the desired sugar/alcohol ratio was reached. The different batches were then blended together and stabilised before sterile bottling.
