Deep ruby fading to crimson at the edges. Raspberry and prune aromas are supported by a mix of cinnamon, white pepper and light mocha tones, with a gentle hint of leather. Ripe cherries, plums and dark chocolate on a generous palate.

As a blend it is a wine to pair with a wide range of dishes. From gourmet pizzas to devilled chicken or pork belly, this wine will bring pure enjoyment.

in the vineyard : Selected pockets from our best vineyards grown on the rippling contours high up on the Groenberg near Wellington.

in the cellar : All seven components of this innovative blend have been vinified separately to preserve and express the unique characteristics of each variety. The wines were matured in French oak barrels for 10 months, of which 15% was new oak. This well-orchestrated regime creates a harmonious, elegantly structured wine.
