It has a full mouth feel with a seductive â€œleather pantsâ€ quality, which is lean with a citrus and vanilla flavour. It ends in a repeated nutty pear skin after taste, echoed many times on the tongue.

in the vineyard : Kaaimansgat literally means â€œCrocodileâ€™s Lairâ€. The name originates from a farm, which will next year have been in the Roux family for 100 years. It is located in a blind valley deep into the mountains near the village of Villiersdorp, set in scenery more reminiscent of the Swiss Alps. The ripening of the Chardonnay grapes in this valley takes place almost one month later than elsewhere in the Cape. The reason for this is due to the impact of parallel mountain ranges, which reduces the length of the diurnal. The vines are non-irrigated and produce grapes that are particularly small berried providing a high skin to juice ratio. It is a unique terroir and consistently produces great fruit.
